

## Strategy & Vision workshop

Synergy's senior management got together on 11 Jan 2014, for a Strategy & Vision workshop. The workshop was facilitated by a well-known organization development consultant, with over two decades of experience in well-known corporates.

The purpose of this workshop was to reflect on the company's journey till now and to develop a vision and strategy for the coming year. The key deliverables of this exercise were to crystallize the company's core values, define 'a Long term strategy and Develop a review mechanism to achieve goals.

The work shop was conducted at a scenic beach resort in Pondicherry. It was an opportunity for all participants to take a break from work and engage in serious discussions and brain storm to chart a road map for the next year.



### ECDIS Update: From the Chart Table

SOLAS regulations, Chapter V Regulation 19, regarding carriage of ECDIS (Electronic Chart Display and Information System) came into effect on 01st January 2011. Installation of at least one ECDIS becomes mandatory in a phased manner from 01st Jul 2012 (for New tankers above 3000 GT) to 01st July 2017 (for existing cargo ships more than 20000 GT). Back up arrangement for this ECDIS will be by either a second ECDIS or an appropriate folio of up-to-date paper charts.

Synergy has type specific ECDIS simulators in our training center. The latest addition is FURUNO. This is a complete CBT driven (instructor free) simulator, where the candidates are systematically presented guidance through lessons streamed on internet from FURUNO's server.

The type specific ECDIS training at Synergy's training center is essentially for an officer who has undergone the generic ECDIS course based on STCW. The type specific course introduces the officer to the features of the ECDIS and trains them on use of ECDIS for passage planning and execution. Our trainers teach the officers to apply the safety features to monitor the vessel's track, limitations of the equipment, procedure to seek license key to open ENC and install updates to the ECDIS.

Synergy Training center now provides many type specific ECDIS training courses. We aim to have type specific ECDIS training for all leading ECDIS types at our center.

Mentors can also be in written form....with many years of experience in the form of books, hence plan to read.
- . The next step is to be a mentor yourself. You can arm your sub-ordinates with knowledge and experience. So take opportunity to contribute directly to training as well as incident investigation, LARP Cards.
- . I would also like to mention a contribution made by one of my colleagues:

Competency = (Knowledge +understanding + Skill) multipled by Attitude.

Last but not the least, I would like to take reference to a statement from one of my mentors: "Success is directly proportional to your application to the situation." This has been kept close to my heart at all times.

We have seen an encouraging shift in perception of safety on board since we implemented this initiative.

The LARP program was developed in-house and reflects our commitment to empower the seafarer create a safe work place on board.






